“DOUBLE RENEGADE”

MATERIALS

HOOK: Size 4-12; 2-4x long.

THREAD: Black

TAG: Red Ultra Chenille.

REAR HACKLE: Brown. It reaches just past the hook point.

ABDOMEN: Peacock herl to mid-point of hook shank.

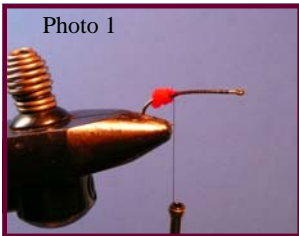
This pattern comes from the book “Effective Lake Flies” by Mike Andreasen and Allan Ryther. It proved very effective on a recent trip to Lake Davis. It is easy to tie.

MID HACKLE: White. Same length as fore and aft hackles

THORAX: Peacock Herl.

FRONT HACKLE: Brown.

TYING INSTRUCTIONS



(PHOTO 1) After debarbing the hook and laying a thread base, secure the red ultra chenille at the bend of the hook and tie off after two wraps. Do not cut the thread.



(PHOTO 2) Tie in a brown hackle and make 3-5 wraps close together. Tie off hackle.



(PHOTO 3) Tie in 3 - 4 peacock herls next to the rear hackle and either with a dubbing loop or twisting the thread with the herls, wrap the herls to the midpoint of the hook shank. Tie off herls.



(PHOTO 4) Tie in the white hackle close to the abdomen and make 3-5 wraps. Tie off hackle.



(PHOTO 5) Tie in 3 - 4 peacock herls as before and wrap forward, leaving enough room for the last hackle and a head.



(PHOTO 6) Tie in 3 - 4 peacock herls as before and wrap forward, leaving enough room for the last hackle and a head.

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
